



TO PROTECT THE TRULY NEEDY, Congress Must Stop ObamaCare Medicaid Expansion Enrollment

ObamaCare expansion enrollment has exploded, putting millions of truly needy individuals at risk.



FACT: *“Every expansion state with available data has enrolled more able-bodied adults than expected to ever enroll. This means even fewer resources are left for the truly needy.”*

An **IMMEDIATE ENROLLMENT FREEZE** would allow Congress and the states to gradually roll back expansion during the transition period.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

1

No new ObamaCare expansion applicants can enroll

2

Those currently enrolled are allowed to stay until their incomes rise or the transition period ends

3

No new states will be able to expand ObamaCare, since the program is winding down

BOTTOM LINE

Limited resources are immediately freed up for the truly vulnerable as able-bodied adults immediately begin to transition back to independence.



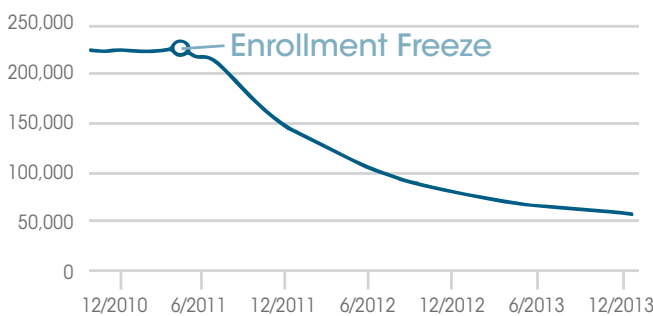
Enrollment Freeze:

States have successfully used enrollment freezes in the past in order to unwind pre-ObamaCare expansion to able-bodied childless adults.



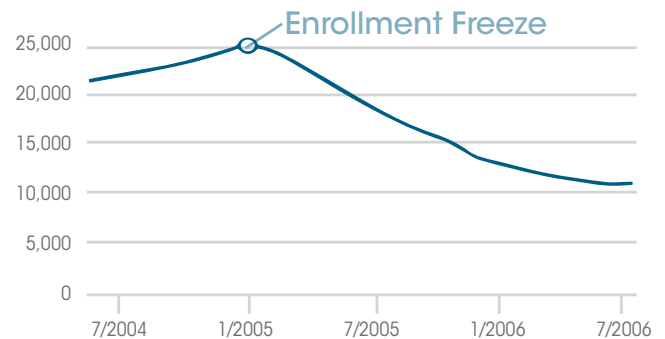
Arizona's Medicaid expansion enrollment dropped 70% within 30 months of freezing enrollment

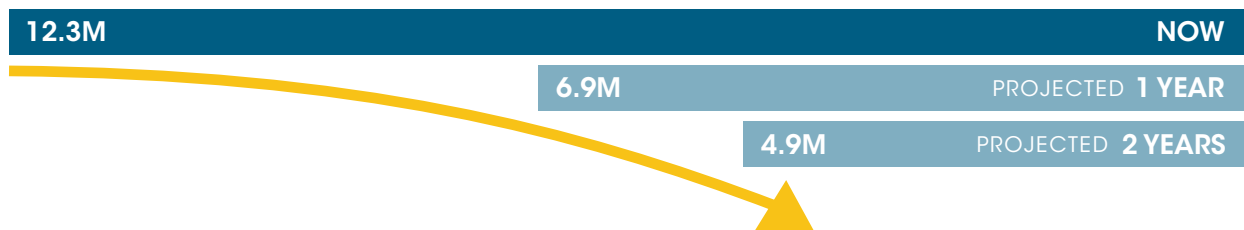
Maine's Medicaid expansion enrollment dropped 57% within 16 months of freezing enrollment

What can Congress expect?

Based on the experiences from these states, Congress could expect enrollment to drop to somewhere around 6.9 million within a year of freezing enrollment. By the end of Year Two, enrollment would likely drop to 4.9 million and would continue to decline until the end of the transition period.



It gets better — enrollment freezes are politically popular.
