The city's job losses and shift cuts are already so severe that the average low-wage worker's **take-home pay has actually decreased** while the minimum wage is still set to *rise by another \$2 to \$15 per hour.*

HOW IT WORKS

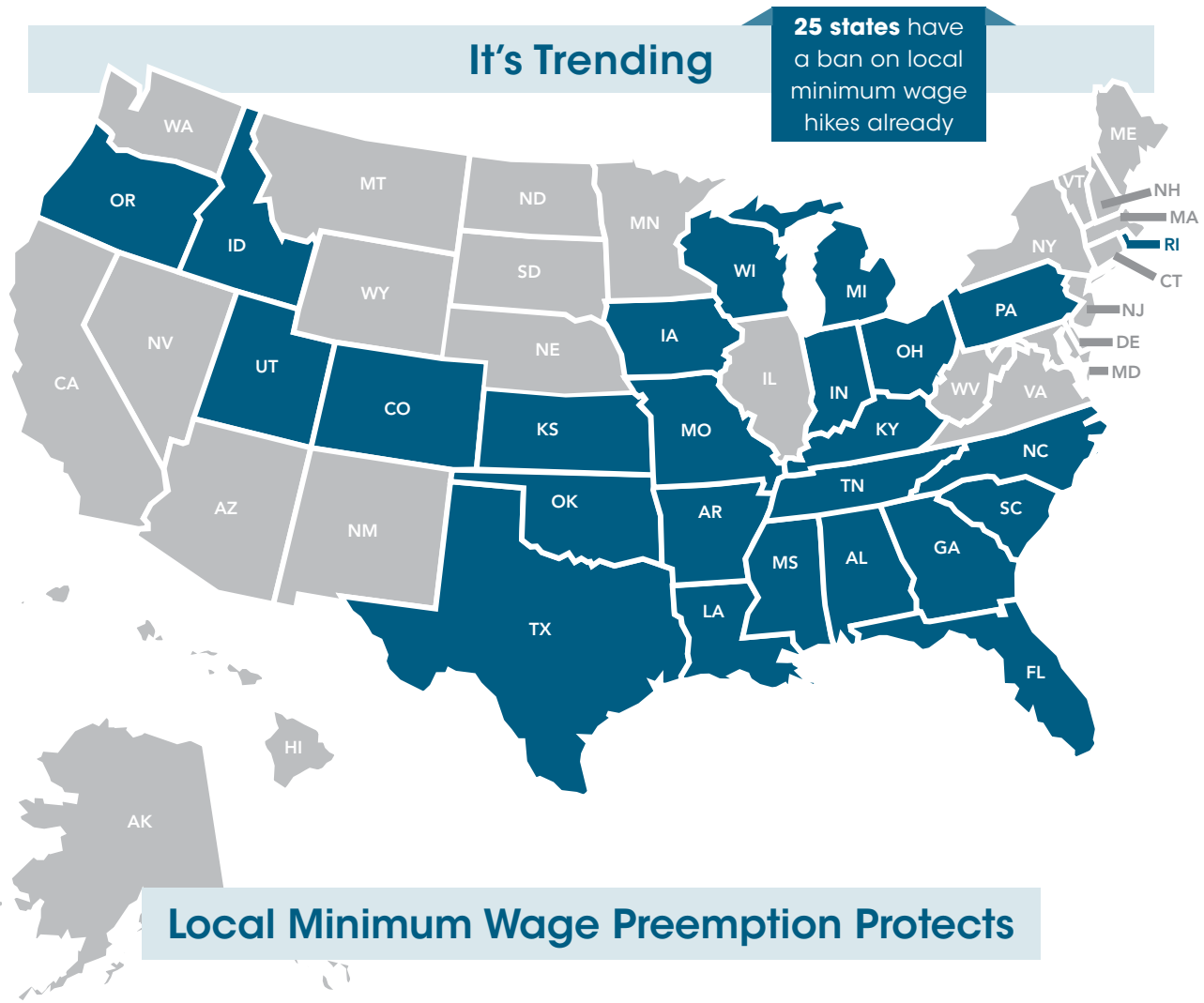


Localities stop enforcing minimum wage laws that differ from the state's minimum wage laws

STRUGGLING WORKERS

The push to raise the minimum wage on the local level is led by labor union-funded activists, not a grassroots movement of struggling workers.

THE NEXT GENERATION

Think of your first job. Would you have hired your teenage self if you had to pay \$15 an hour? Half of minimum wage earners are under 25 and two-thirds work part-time.
