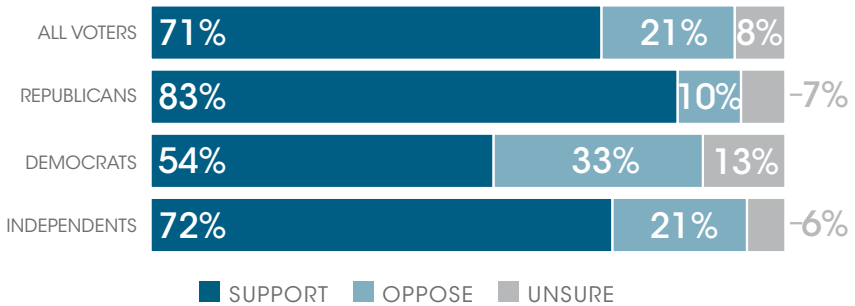




Arkansans Support Medicaid Work Requirements

▶ Arkansas voters support the state’s initiative requiring able-bodied, working-age adults who have no children to work, train, or volunteer at least 20 hours per week in order to receive Medicaid benefits.



The Facts

Applies to: ▶ Childless, able-bodied adults of working age.

Exempts: ▶ Those with medical conditions that can affect their ability to work.
▶ Individuals with disabilities, seniors, and kids.

Requires: ▶ Enrollees must work, train, or volunteer at least 20 hours per week and report those hours to keep their benefits.

Work Requirements Work

- After work requirements in food stamps:**
- ▶ Enrollees went back to work in more than 600 different industries.
 - ▶ Their incomes more than doubled.
 - ▶ Their increased incomes more than offset lost benefits.
 - ▶ Their time on welfare was cut in half.

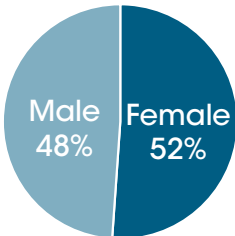

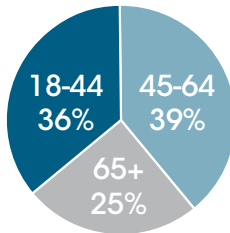

METHODOLOGY

Results for this poll are based on automated telephone interviews conducted among a statewide sample of 514 likely voters in Arkansas. Data for this survey research was collected by Cor Strategies Inc. The surveys were conducted September 17-19, 2018.

The margin of sampling error is plus or minus 4.32 percentage points. The margin of sampling error may be higher for certain subgroups. Results presented may not always appear to total 100 percent due to rounding.

Data was sampled using weighted demographic information from state election authorities. Demographic information for actual voters in past elections were used to construct sample target weights.
