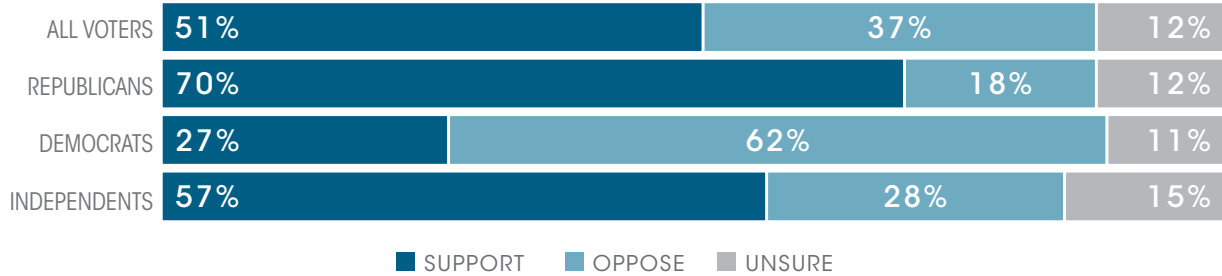




Voters Oppose the Unemployment Bonus

Voters support the expiration of the \$600 unemployment bonus.

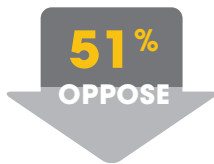


THESE MESSAGES WORK BEST

There were **518,000 more open jobs** in June vs. May

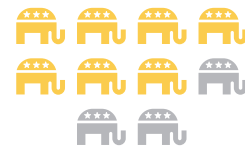
KEY TAKEAWAY: AMERICANS PREFER WORK OVER LONG-TERM DEPENDENCY



51 percent oppose bringing back the \$600 unemployment bonus

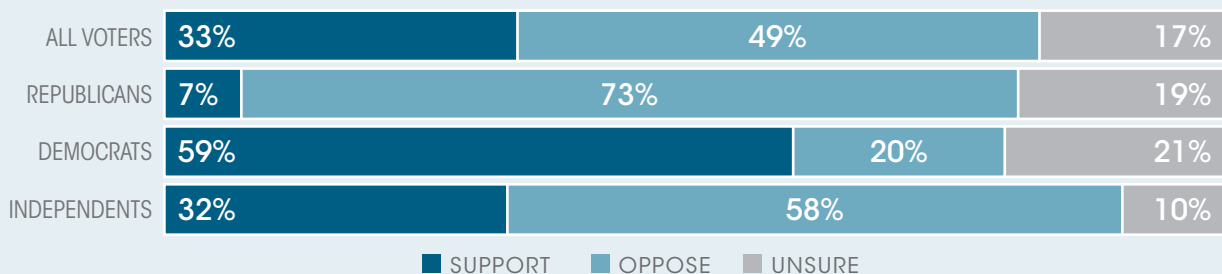


Six in 10 independents oppose bringing back the \$600 unemployment bonus

Voters Oppose the Unemployment Bonus

KEY MESSAGES

Employment **increased by 1.8 million jobs** in July and unemployment dropped almost a whole point

Online job postings are **up 16 percent** since April, increasing to nearly where they were in 2017

The U.S. GDP estimate has **more than doubled** since July 31st

There are **more than one million new small business startups** since June

More than 117,000 new businesses were formed during the week of August 1, a **55 percent increase** from the first two months of the year

ON AVERAGE, ONLY 35% OF VOTERS SUPPORT REVIVING THE BONUSES, EVEN IF THE AMOUNT IS REDUCED
