



Child Support Cooperation for Childcare Subsidies

THE PROBLEM: TOO FEW SINGLE-PARENT FAMILIES ARE RECEIVING THE CHILD SUPPORT THEY DESERVE



When single-parent families do not receive what they are owed, they are **robbed of thousands of dollars** in extra income.



This income is life changing for someone trapped in dependency and poverty.



Of the 800,000 families and 1.32 million children receiving childcare subsidies, nearly **80 percent are single-parent households.**

THE SOLUTION: REQUIRE CHILD SUPPORT COOPERATION

States should enact child support cooperation requirements for parents seeking childcare subsidies. **This reform requires parents to cooperate with child support collection efforts before receiving subsidies so that the responsibilities of dead-beat parents aren't shifted onto taxpayers.**

This reform will:



reduce stress on single-parent families.



help create a stable learning environment for children.




allow parents to get back to work.
