



# West Virginia Filibuster Poll

ALL VOTERS

**1. The filibuster, as it is currently used, is a parliamentary tool used by both Republicans and Democrats in the United States Senate for more than a century as a way to delay or stop a vote on controversial legislation by requiring more votes than just a simple majority. The number required to end a filibuster is currently 60 out of 100 senators, meaning the legislation would then have to receive bipartisan support in order to pass. Generally speaking, do you support or oppose the Senate filibuster?**

**2. Would you support or oppose ending the filibuster so that President Joe Biden can pass more of his agenda into law?**

Support	38%
Oppose	40%
Unsure	21%

**3. If West Virginia Senator Joe Manchin voted to get rid of the filibuster, would you be more or less likely to vote to reelect him?**

More Likely	30%
Less Likely	56%
Unsure	14%



Results for this poll are based on automated telephone interviews conducted among a statewide sample of 507 likely West Virginia voters. Data for this survey research was collected by Cor Services, Inc.

Interviews were conducted via a computer-assisted telephone interviewing system utilizing techniques designed to achieve the highest possible respondent cooperation.

The surveys were conducted March 31–April 2, 2021. The margin of sampling error is plus or minus 4.35 percentage points. The margin of sampling error may be higher for certain subgroups. Results presented may not always appear to total 100 percent due to rounding.

Data was sampled using weighted demographic information from the U.S. Census Bureau’s Current Population Survey Voting and Registration Supplement and the state election authorities. Demographic information for actual voters in past elections were used to construct sample target weights.
