

In Tennessee, it's easy to vote, but hard to cheat

As Secretary of State of Tennessee, Tre Hargett believes that voter integrity is at the center of the American way of governing, both in Tennessee and the nation as a whole.

Voters want to believe there's a level playing field when they cast a ballot, and when they don't believe that, it erodes the public confidence in the process.

Here Sec. Hargett speaks on election integrity reforms that have passed in Tennessee, and how making it easy to vote, but hard to cheat, means Tennesseans can vote knowing that each eligible ballot will be fairly counted.

"Our job is not to run a Republican election or a Democrat election. It's to run an election where every citizen feels like their vote was counted once—no more, no less—and with the highest level of integrity."
